Dear President Obama:

On May 22, 2015, the undersigned member organizations of the Whales Need US (WNUS) coalition, representing millions of US citizens, wrote to the Secretaries of Commerce, Interior and State to express our concerns with the start of the 2015 whaling season in Iceland and ongoing exports of whale products (see attached). Specifically, the undersigned organizations requested that your administration immediately impose targeted economic trade sanctions on Icelandic companies linked to whaling, based on the Pelly Amendment certifications of Iceland in July 2011 and February 2014, and your subsequent Presidential Directives of September 15, 2011 and April 1, 2014.

Since that letter, it has been confirmed that 1,800 metric tons of endangered fin whale products have left Iceland on board the *Winter Bay*, destined for Japan. Although the vessel destination was initially listed as Luanda, Angola and then Tema, Ghana, the *Winter Bay* has been tracked across the North Atlantic and docked at Tromso, Norway on June 11. In a recent interview with local media, Kristján Loftsson, the head of the Hvalur whaling company, confirmed that he is looking to ship the whale products to Japan through the Arctic via the Northeast Passage, following the stop in Norway.¹

While we appreciate the heightened diplomatic measures taken against Iceland under your 2011 and 2014 directives, we believe that these measures clearly have not been sufficient to deter Iceland from whaling and trade in whale products. We believe that stronger actions are necessary, and should be taken as quickly as possible to avoid another season of whaling in 2015 and more trade.

We therefore urge you to immediately impose more substantive measures as allowed under the Pelly Amendment, including the imposition of targeted trade sanctions against companies in Iceland with ties to the whaling industry (see Annex), until such time as Iceland ceases its commercial whaling program and international commercial trade in whale products.
